
The HK Umbrella Movement: Actors, Issues, & Its Significance Au Loong Yu



1. CCP's policy towards HK

- 1997-8: The hand-picked Provisional Legislative Council over turned the Collective Bargaining law;
- 2003: Govt withdraw the National Security Bill, after it sparked off a 500,000 protests.
- 2010: Struck a deal with some pan democrat parties to enlarge the seats of direct election in the Legislative Council.

...and the Writings on the Wall

- March 2008, Xi Jinping was elected Vice President of the state;
- Oct 2010, Xi was elected Vice Chairman of the Central Military Commission;
- Nov 2012, Xi was elected General Secretary.
- March 2012, C Y Leung was elected Chief Executive of HK.
- August 31, 2014: the Standing Committee of the People's Congress made the decision on defining the political reform package in HK.

What is the CCP?

- The HK's perspective of political spectrum: Binary opposition of for or against the absolutist state;
- Or describing the current CCP as "leftists"
- A rupture occurred in 1989. The CCP regime as far right authoritarian capitalist state.
- The ruling bureaucracy also act as capitalists: the combination of coercive power and the power of capital.

- Tainted milk; 2008 Wenchuan Earth quark scandal; Gutter oil; Murder of Li Wangyang
- Rafael Hui, former Chief Secretary, was charged with corruption in HK last years and sentenced to 7.5 years in prison. He revealed in the court that he received 1.41 million US\$ of gift, probably from the former head of the Beijing's HK and Macau Affair office.


Undisguised Dictatorship by the Bourgeoisie

 C.Y. Leung, the Chief Executive of the Hong Kong government, in explaining why Hong Kong people cannot have genuine universal suffrage said that this "would allow the city government to follow more business-friendly policies... if it's entirely a numbers game and numeric representation, then obviously you would be talking to half of the people in Hong Kong who earn less than \$1,800 a month. Then you would end up with that kind of politics and policies."



- 25 July, five main chambers of commerce released a statement condemned the plan of occupation.
- 21 Sept, a delegates of local tycoons including Li Ka Shing were invited to visit Beijing and received by Xi, and lectured by the latter that the Central govt oppose any "illegal" actions in HK.

- Individual visitors / parallel traders / property buyers (total no. of visitors to HK in 2013: 54.3million; Mainlanders: 40.75 million / 75%)
- New Immigrants
- Chinese companies accounts for 60% of stock market value. It is common that their management make their employees to vote for the pro-Beijing parties

The Political Evolution of HKFS

- 1970 the language right movement
- 1971 the Defend Diaoyu Island movement
- 1973 the China Week
- 1983 Supported the return of sovereignty of HK to China
- 1989 Broke with the CCP regime
- 2014 Umbrella movement: "Destiny of HK be decided by HK people"
- 14/2/15, HKU students voted in favour of quitting the HKFS.

7. The Pan-Democrats

- Achievement: promotion of democratic awareness
- Never question the Basic Law:
- Article 45 &6: Gradual and orderly implementation of universal suffrage; An unspecified nomination committee to elect the CE
- Article 107: balanced budget a must
- Article 108: low tax policy a must
- Article 112: No foreign exchange control
- Article 114: No Tariff
- Article 5 : The previous capitalist system shall remain unchanged for 50 years

- Believe CCP will respect the Basic Law and all its promises
- Law abiding and no civil disobedience
- Universal suffrage as single issue campaign
- Authoritarianism within the movement
- Have 27 seats among 70 in the Legislature, split into 9-10 parties


